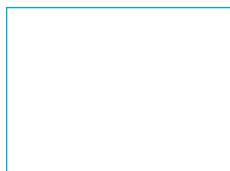
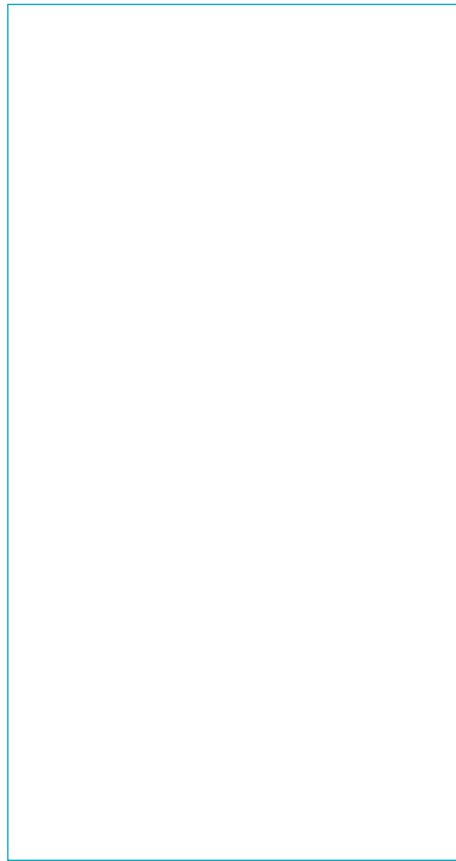




Please return to Electoral Registration Office. You can get the address from your phone book.



Who can register to vote?

- Anyone 16 or over (but you cannot vote until your 18th birthday).
- British or Commonwealth citizens.
- Citizens of the Irish Republic or other European Union (EU) countries.

Citizens of EU countries other than the UK or Irish Republic cannot vote in Westminster parliamentary elections, and must fill in a separate form to vote in European parliamentary elections.

How do I register to vote?

1. Fill in the form attached to this leaflet.
2. Make sure you sign the 'declaration'.
3. Return the form to your local electoral registration office.
4. Register as soon as you can. It may be too late once an election has been announced as it usually takes up to seven weeks to add your details.
